ABSTRACT OF Dr. Santosh Bothe (M.Sc., Ph.D.), LECTURE:

Principal Prof. Dr. Santosh Bothe emphasized that the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 aims to bridge the gap between junior and higher education, fostering skill development and employability in students. This wide-ranging policy marks a important milestone in India's educational journey, prioritizing all-inclusive education and learning outcomes.

NEP 2020 seeks to transform India's education system, making it more inclusive, equitable, and holistic. The policy's key provisions and principles focus on reforming school and higher education, with a vision to create a vibrant knowledge society. Further in his speech he said that NEP 2020 will have an universal access ensuring universal access to school education, from preschool to secondary level, with a focus on inclusivity and equity.

He also said that this policy will be promoting holistic education and learning outcomes, with an emphasis on developing 21st-century skills. NEP 2020 is introducing flexibility and autonomy in education, with a focus on choice-based learning and multidisciplinary approaches. UG programs will have three or four years to run, with multiple points of entry, exit, and re-entry. Research Opportunities: Students will have the opportunity to pursue research projects in their major subject of study, with the possibility of receiving research credits. The policy emphasizes the promotion of Indian languages, culture, and values, with a focus on building a more robust and responsive education system.

Overall, NEP 2020 aims to create a more inclusive, equitable, and holistic education system, with a focus on developing 21st-century skills and promoting Indian languages and culture.
